Tips & Steps on Applying for a Pardon - Many people mistakenly think that applying for a pardon is an expensive and complicated process. This is a myth. You do not need a lawyer or representative to apply for a pardon. This will not accelerate the review of your application or convey a special status on it. The Parole Board of Canada is the only agency that can grant a pardon in Canada and it treats all applications in the same way.
